

## SHOPPING

As a shopping centre Limassol offers the full range from ultra-modern to traditional and handmade. Busy St Andrews Street in the old town, not far from the seafront promenade, makes a fascinating trip with its old-fashioned buildings and overhanging terraces, under which a large amount of small shops vie for attention on this narrow street. Another important shopping street is Makarios III Avenue, where many prestigious boutiques and showrooms are located, as well as small shops of every type.

### My Mall

My Mall opened its doors on Saturday, May 30 2009. Built on an expansive area of 204,000 sq. metres in Limassol, the "convenience" shopping mall is the largest retail centre in Cyprus, boasting around 150 exciting and popular retail shops, 17 catering outlets and the only indoor ice skating rink on the island. There is a free daily shuttle bus operating every hour from 10:00 until 18:00 between Le Méridien Limassol Spa & Resort and My Mall with the last bus returning at 20:30.

### Main Shopping Areas

The main shopping areas of Limassol include Makarios III Ave, Anexartisias and Agiou Andreou Streets. The shopping paradises in Limassol provide a full range from ultra-modern to traditional items. Tourists can find plenty of clothes, footwear, leather accessories and also some superb jewellery shops scattered all over the town. There are two Debenhams Department stores in Limassol, one located by the sea and the other in the town centre. There are also two Marks & Spencer's stores, one in the town centre and the other in My Mall. For the kids there is Jumbo Toy Store.

### Market

The Central Municipal Market of Lemesos (Limassol), a large, stone built structure, consisting of big halls and shops occupying an area of 3000 square metres, is situated in the old town. It was built in 1917 but took its present form in 1947
